Needs and Actions A Mismatch

Despite the belief that a home's maintenance impacts its market value, few homeowners in Ontario actually have plans in place to maintain the air quality, drinking water, heating and cooling systems in their homes.

While 90 per cent of the

650 people who took part in the Decima Research Inc. poll, funded by Direct Energy Essential Home Services, responded that maintenance impacted market value, almost 2/3 reported that they are without a service plan for their furnace or air conditioner.

Of those who have taken steps to increase the efficiency of their heating and cooling systems, most have only gone so far as to install a programmable thermostat, leaving many opportunities for contractors to suggest upgrades to the current systems.

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
